<u>Thames Valley School of Psychiatry Study leave Guidance for Trainees,</u> <u>Psychiatric and Educational Supervisors</u> 2022/2023 (version1 June 2022)

All in programme postgraduate psychiatry trainees, including those in trust (LEP) funded posts and academic trainees, will have access to the centralised HEETV study budget and be eligible for 30 days of study leave annually. Trainees on OOPR, OOPC and OOPE are excluded but those on an OOPT are included. There is no longer a notional individual allocation per trainee and the focus will be on individual requirements in order to achieve curricular outcomes and discretionary additional activity to enhance personal development.

This guidance is specific to psychiatry but please note that the Health Education England Thames Valley Study Leave <u>Guidance</u> must be read and followed by all trainees and their trainers (PS, CS/ES ie whoever is signing the study leave application in the trainee's current post). There are agreed local processes in place to manage the application, approval and reimbursement of the centralised study budget. You will be given details at your trust induction.

Study leave does NOT cover:

- Time and cost of Mandatory training that is required by NHS Trusts to fulfill trainee's clinical role
- RCPsych membership and exam fees and related expenses
- Books, online MCQs

Protected local educational events

Please note that the following regular **protected educational events** are timetabled in work schedules for psychiatry trainees and do not require study leave application or approval:

- Trust based Psychotherapy teaching (including supervision, CBDGs) for Core trainees
- A weekly Academic Meeting in Local trust, department or for regional specialty which should be attended by trainees alongside other colleagues
- Trust Journal/critical appraisal club for core trainees
- Time to attend Special interest/research sessions for higher trainees (now called Professional Development Sessions or PDS in new curricula).

Psychiatry Curricula, Placement specific PDPs and study leave

From august 2022, many trainees will follow the new curricula for their specialty and be supported by the new trainee portfolio. At the start and throughout each placement the trainee and PS will identify the HLOs and key capabilities that they plan to achieve in the placement. This will be documented in the portfolio. This placement specific PDP will identify planned activities and the type of evidence used to assess the progress of the trainee.

Schools and HETV local offices may be providing local educational activities eg courses, exam preparation and on line resources which have already been funded to support attainment of

the KCs. High quality locally delivered activity is preferred where possible Some educational activities linked to KCs may also be outside of the placement and these may be supported by study leave and funding providing that they follow the HEE principles for approving an educational activity.

The Recommended List

The following is a list of recommended activities/courses for psychiatry trainees. A few are are currently considered to be essential eg an MRCPsych course for core trainees and MHA Sec 12 approval for higher trainees. Others on the list are considered to be the best means to achieve curriculum delivery and are recommended. It should be viewed as a guide for trainees and their CS/PS/ES when considering study leave/funding during the Placement specific PDP discussions with the PS in the early supervision sessions. The RCPsych specialist advisory committees (SACs) will be advising on the activities that might be recommended for achieving the key capabilities. Consequently the list will need to be amended.

OVERSEAS STUDY:

Overseas travel is not a requirement/essential to attain any psychiatry curriculum capabilities but might be approved in exceptional circumstances and only once during a core or higher training programme. Read the HETV guidance carefully and provide a full explanation on the application as to how the request meets the criteria. All applications for events overseas will need to be approved FIRST by HETV study leave team (as per application form) who will discuss the proposed application with the TPD and Head of School. After the HETV team has made a decision the trainee will need to apply to their trust in the usual way giving evidence of the HETV approval.

REQUESTS EXCEEDING £700

Any application for funding exceeding £700 MUST be sent for additional scrutiny to the TPD and their support needs to be included in the application

ASPIRATIONAL FUNDING

There are opportunities to apply for aspirational study leave. This is defined as "educational or professional development opportunities that enhances the knowledge, skills and attitudes of the doctor in training, or enhances any aspect of patient care, but is not mapped to any direct curriculum requirements". Aspirational leave does need to be consistent with a trainee's PDP and all essential curricular requirements must have been achieved. Eg CT2/3 trainees may consider activities that would enhance their progress to higher specialty training, providing they can demonstrate good progress with curriculum requirements and essential study leave activities. Full or partial funding will be considered. It is essential that these discussions take place well in advance of the course start date as retrospective applications cannot be accepted. Don't hesitate to discuss aspirational ideas with your TPD and HOS as early as possible.

GENERAL QUERIES

The new psychiatry curricula do not mandate courses and psychiatry trainees are advised to consider the recommended courses here when thinking about study leave activities and how to achieve the KCs embedded within their specific curricula. We would be interested to hear about other activities that may be aspirational and a direct discussion with your TPD and/or HOS would be a good starting point! Don't hesitate to e-mail us.
