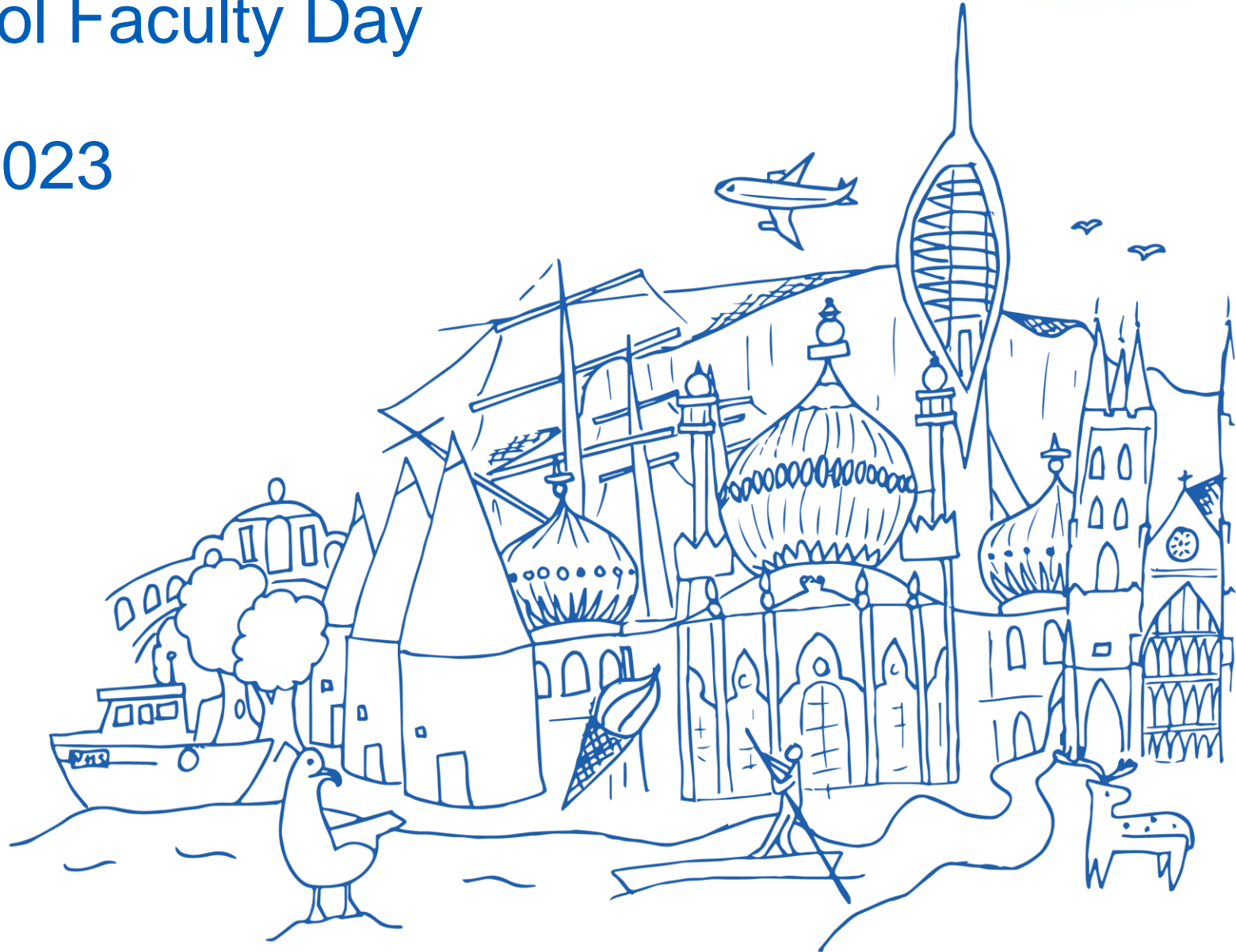

The intention here is to help you stay resilient, fully resourced and energised.

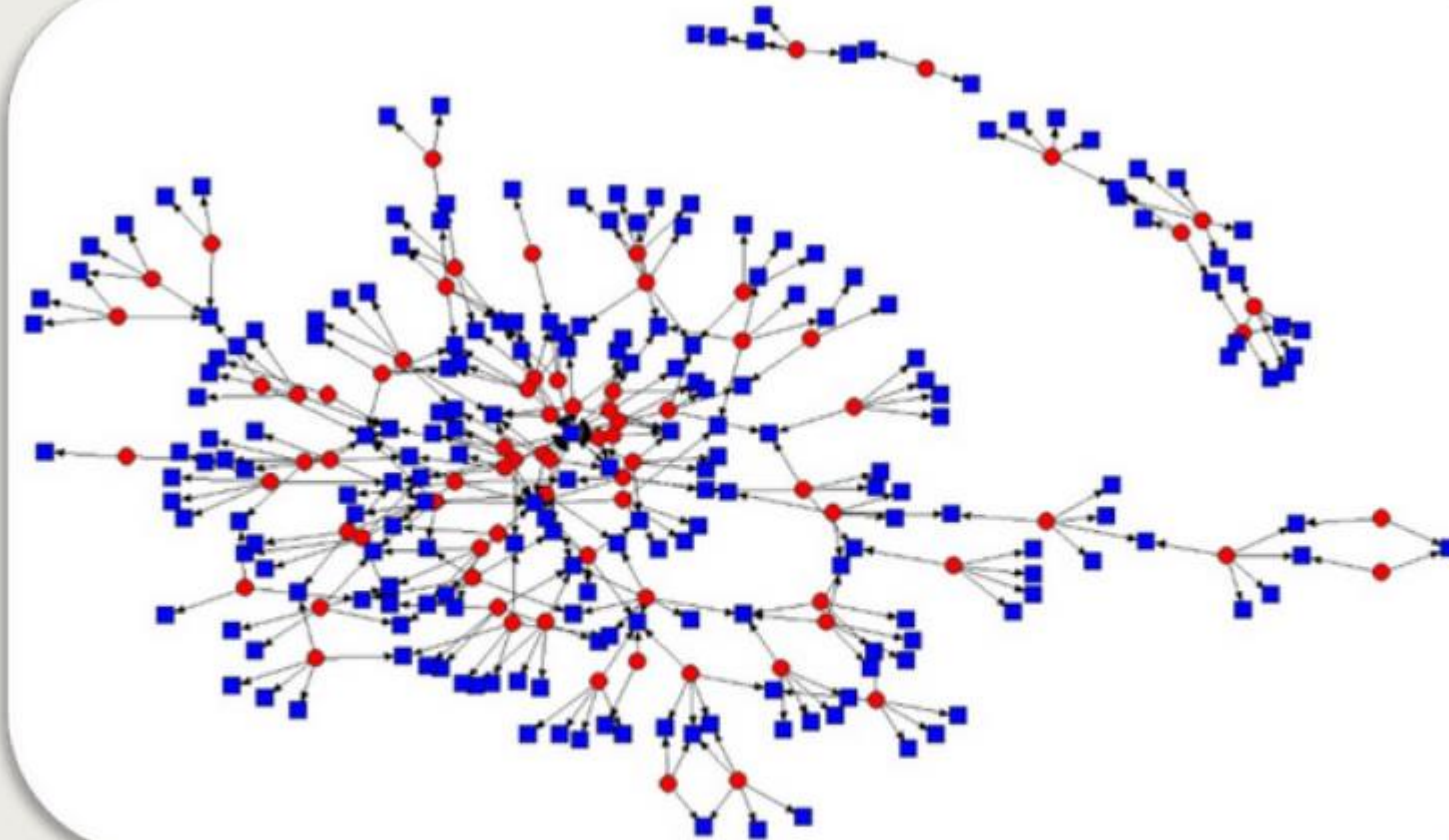
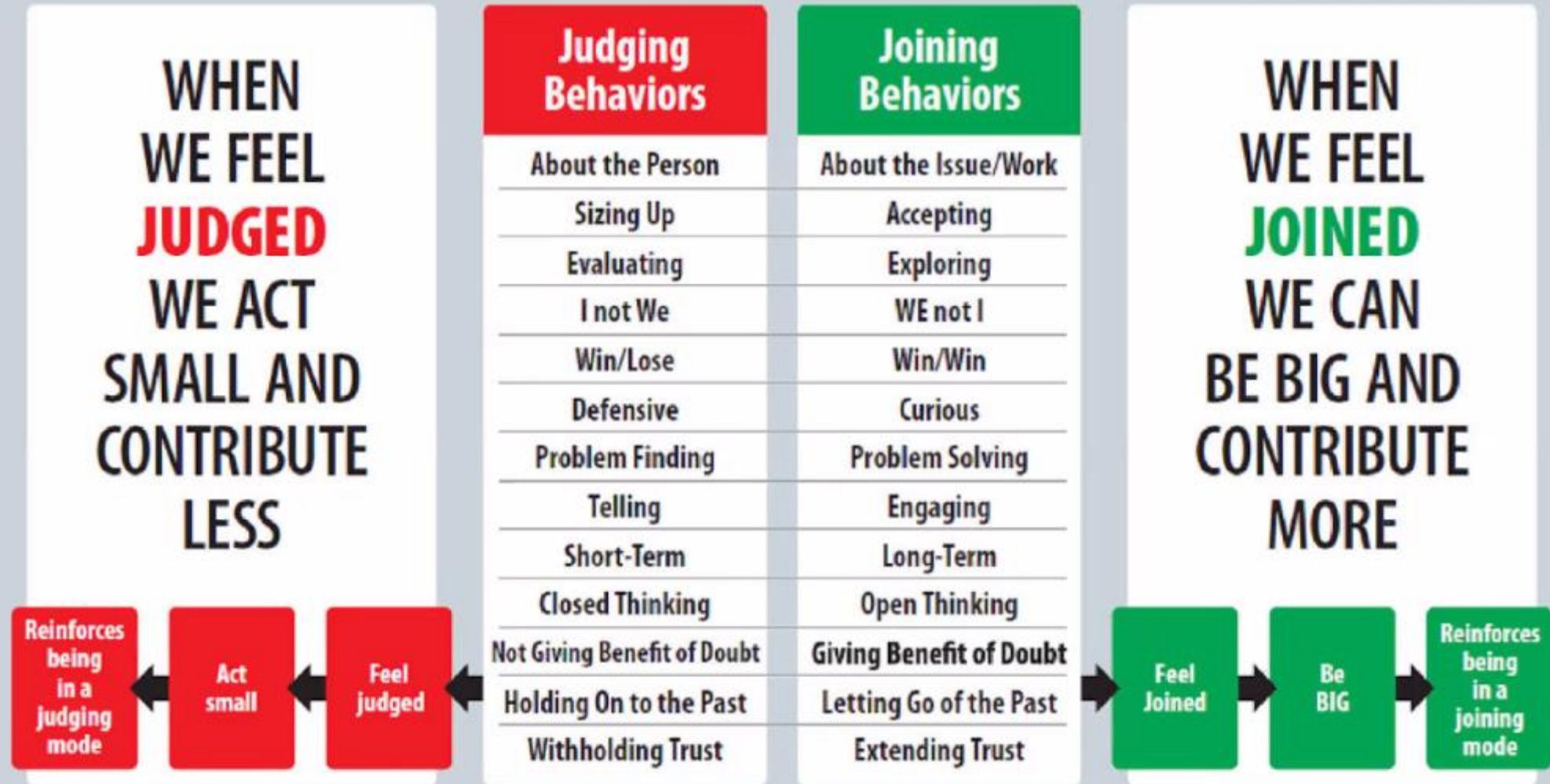


Figure A: The social network of a high performing organisation

Exam Support Fellowship Report

Introduction

I applied for the fellowship following a recommendation by a colleague who was about to complete his year on the scheme. I naturally gravitated specifically towards the Exam Support Fellowship as I felt having recently completed my GP training and undertaken the MRCGP exams, I was in a good position to help trainees.

I am particularly interested in communication skills and how this year occurred during a time of change for the RCGP, as the e-Recorded Consultation Assessment (RCA) to the Simulated Consultation Assessment (SCA) was introduced. I am interested in how we could help trainees approach this slight change.

Project Inspiration

My project idea was inspired by RCA preparation sessions with trainees during the pandemic. We would watch a video recording provided by a trainee and then discuss it as a group critique how it went. I found these sessions an invaluable learning experience for myself against my peers, as well as really understand the exam approach marking the videos. Unfortunately, it transpired that the sessions were no longer able to hold these sessions. Interestingly the role play replacement were much more poorly attended by trainees.

Pharmacy technicians' integration in primary care: A service evaluation and a cost saving analysis

Background:

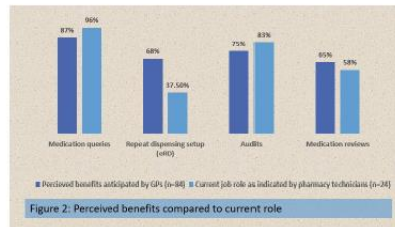
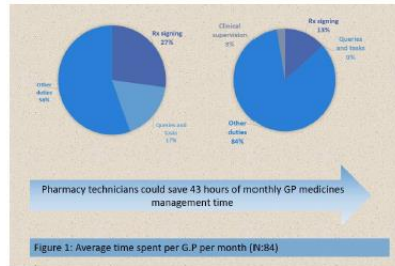
- The National Institute of Health and Social Care Research recent study concluded that the introduction of skill mix employment in primary care did not reduce NHS expenditure or general practitioner workload (1).
- Emerging evidence reveals positive contributions of pharmacy professionals in general practices in terms of reducing general practitioners' (G.P.s) workload. One post saving up to 80 hours per month (2).
- Pharmacy technician's role is starting to take shape in primary care, it is now included in the Additional Role Re-imbursement scheme (ARR) (3).
- Engagement of other staff groups in the new role awareness and redesign optimises benefits and the integration process quality.

Aim:

To investigate if the integration of pharmacy technicians in primary care has a potential cost saving benefit or reduction in G.P.s workload. To identify points of optimisation along the integration process.

Methods:

- Two online surveys to all practicing G.P.s and Pharmacy technicians in Thames Valley and Wessex region.
- G.P Survey included a mixture of quantitative and open questions to evaluate G.P.s medicines management workload, perceived role of pharmacy technicians and if training support needed.
- Pharmacy technicians' survey included a mixture of quantitative and qualitative questions to explore current role and training needs.



Conclusion:

- Participating G.P.s indicated perceived role benefits of the integration of pharmacy technicians in primary care.

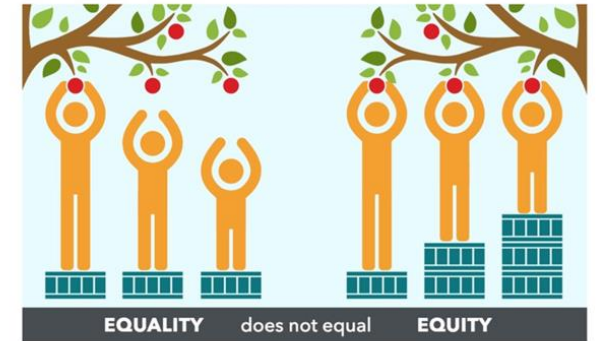
