² My research plan.

The focus of my research was primarily how the cost of living affects local communities. I had to focus on where I thought was most important within the sector of cost of living. I chose my research to be around child poverty within deprived areas of Portsmouth. I wanted to highlight what child poverty is and how it is affecting the youth and families of this generation from mental health, unhealthy lifestyles, poor education and lack of essentials.

I spilt my research into 5 categories these were

- What is your focus for research?
- Which is the community your research will be on
- What do you expect /hope the impact of your research will be?
- What methods do you plan to use to carry out your research?
- Data analysis and presentation.

Breaking the research into these categories helped me narrow down and give key focus to where I wanted the research to go and helped me set goals and time frame on how to achieve getting the most from our community.

We had 1 year to complete this research I spent at least 2 months at the beginning having deeper conversations with the community to know what my subject of the research was going to be.

³My methods of collecting data

During the research process how I collected my data is vastly important. For the first 2 months I spent in foodbank sessions within the deprived parts of our city having conversations with the service users about their hardships with the cost of living and what are the top three things they were affected by the most.

These conversations determined my research project and where I needed to focus after the initial 2 months. I then thought about ways to gather data more sufficiently to what I needed. The ways i did this were as followed:

- 1 on 1 interviews face to face, if people couldn't do this i accommodated by zoom calls, video calls or phone calls at what time suited them best.
- I held a coffee morning with a group of parents to discuss issues around cost of living.
- Online google survey for everyone to access

The google online survey form was the most successful as I was able to have visual charts and comments from parents to use in my presentation and giving them their own voice word by word in this process was so vastly important to our community.
